



2014 Stewardship Campaign

Every few years most Church of England parishes run a stewardship campaign. Stewardship is the term the

church uses to remind us that this parish, its church and the work that we do to bring about God's kingdom is our responsibility and can only happen through our funding, our volunteering and our prayers. This year the prayer and volunteering side of stewardship is being dealt with in detail by the Parish Development Plan (see Pg 1) so our stewardship campaign is focused solely on money and follows the theme of 'Giving in Grace'.

This is the money that we give regularly by standing order, or in the envelopes, or on the collection plate, or by gifts or legacies. It is the money that pays for the running and upkeep of our church buildings, part of the costs of our ministries teams as well as the work we do in the local community.

Christ Church has always been a generous parish and even in these difficult financial times that generosity has continued. However, last year we received over £2500 <u>less</u> than it costs to run the parish. Our Parish Development Plan also has ambitions to bring God's word and love to the people of Fulwood and we want to be able to support this with a small amount of money.

Our stewardship campaign this year is focused on raising an extra £5000 per year. So how can I help I hear you cry? If you already give through your bank, by standing order, then when the stewardship pack drops through your door please consider giving roughly 10% extra if you can. If your regular giving is £1 then that would mean 10p extra and if it is £10 then it would mean £1 more. Please consider donating by standing order if you don't already and if you are a taxpayer then please gift aid your offerings. The pack will show you how easy it is to do this. Lastly, if you are considering legacies please do consider keeping Christ Church and its work in mind.

If reading this leaves you feeling in any way unhappy or concerned because you are already giving what you can, then please know that this campaign is only aimed at ensuring others are as generous as you already are.

We ask for your prayers and ask that everyone please fill in the pledge forms, standing orders and gift aid forms when they drop through your door early next month. We have been able to make good use of the quiet summer time of hall usage to carry out the boiler replacement and kitchen refurbishment, with the grant (60%) from the Lancashire Environment Fund, without causing too much disruption to the normal running of the hall. An advance from the fund has enabled us to start the work now, but as with all such grants, we have to complete the work before claiming anything back. As we are coming to the end of the "Hall 4 All" Committee's work, we have to be careful not to spend too much before grants are paid. The treasurer (Margaret Brown) must be thanked for guiding us through these tricky financial waters.

Further to advice from Edward Clarke a new boiler has been installed and commissioned in the Hall boiler room The continuing good weather has meant that it has not been used yet.

A more complex operation, requiring the co-ordination of several disparate groups, has been the refurbishment of the kitchen. The work is not quite finished and the snagging list needs to be resolved, but the majority of it has now been completed. The result is quite spectacular and the new granite work surface is bound to impress potential hirers (see photo back cover).

Thanks to all who have worked hard to ensure that this work was carried out as smoothly as possible. [Keith Cameron]
