

Happiness is not a destination, it's a way of life. On Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> October we will be celebrating our annual Harvest Service. This seems to hold more significance this year as we consider the plight of refugees and those less fortunate than ourselves around the world. As a focus leading up to this service, we will be reflecting on and supporting the Bishop's Harvest Appeal which was launched by Bishop Julian to support people

in Columbia and Malawi. We could also consider the story of "The Good Samaritan" as we ponder on what we should do to help others, no matter where they are in the world.

This year's appeal is for a Christian Aid partner 'Corambiente' in Colombia, where malnutrition affects 60% of the children. The appeal also supports Tearfund partner '*Eagles'* in Malawi where unpredictable weather is reducing



food production. *Eagles* is developing conservation agriculture which will help farmers to increase yields.

Leaflets and posters will be appearing within church soon with more details about this appeal and how we can contribute financially.

It may seem that given the present crisis of refugees in Europe that this is a small matter, yet action now may prevent others becoming destitute and becoming refugees in the future.

At our Harvest Service, we will collect food to be distributed to those within our community who are in need. Please could we request that donations are in tins or packets; no fresh fruit or vegetables please as it takes a few days for distribution and we don't want anything to go off!!

"Those who trust in the LORD will find new strength.

They will soar high on wings like eagles. They will run and not grow weary. They will walk and not faint." (Isaiah 40:31)
