A thought from the Vicar - Easter

I am writing this at the beginning of Lent, though by the time you read it we will be half way through and Easter will be approaching. As I write the news makes for hard reading or viewing, with increases in knife crime, failures in our leaders to deal with racist allegations in their parties and the continual backdrop of Brexit. It leaves us to wonder if humanity really does have the answers that our comfortable western existence lulls us into thinking we have.



In some ways Lent and Easter are very appropriate times as we consider a Christian response to what is happening around us. Lent is a time given in the church's year for contemplation on our own fallen nature and the ways we fall short of God's goodness. The events in the news just underpin this. Our response is often to question God's goodness, but whenever we point the finger it is worth remembering that three (fingers) always point had. The

remembering that three (fingers) always point back. The way as humans we structure our societies, handle conflict and seek our rights before those of our neighbour exacerbates any disaster. The reflection of God's goodness in us all, marred as it is by our sin, still comes out in the



generosity of people's response but sometimes it feels like we are bolting the stable door after the horse has bolted. The damage of our sin is already done.



This is the bad news, but Lent is not a time for us to look inward and give up because Lent leads us to Easter. Though we in ourselves cannot deal with sin, the message of Easter is that God deals with it for us. On the cross Jesus subjected himself to the power of sin and death. He faced it and through his resurrection overcame it. This

does not mean the capacity for sin and evil is gone; one look at the news headlines or our own hearts will tell us this. But it does mean that the power of sin to imprison us and hold us is broken. We have been shown a better way, and through the resurrection are given hope beyond death. In this life we have the hope of the Holy Spirit to strengthen us and help us change.






