





Our meeting this month is on **Thursday 18th January** at 7.30pm in the Church Hall when another of our parishioners is speaking – on Hidden Burma. As Burma



'October Count'

Thanks for your help in 'signing in' to church during the first four Sundays in October, the details have been confirmed by PCC and sent to the Diocese.

Each year during October we are asked by the Diocese to let them know how many adults and children are in church each Sunday and how many additional adults attend services during the following week. These figures are collected from every church throughout the Diocese during October and are used to help decide the Parish Share (how much each church contributes towards the Diocese); much of this covers the cost of our Vicar, Vicarage, etc. For us, last year, the Parish Share was over £60,000 so it's significant!!
