

Happy New Year?!? - 'ending' and 'starting'

At the time of writing this article, the results of the snap election have been announced and we are faced with a hung parliament. By the time this magazine has been produced, any number of changes may have taken place - I can't possibly know at this point who will be in charge of our government!!



It is yet another "new year" or restart/reboot for our country, and there would seem to be many different times in our culture when this "new year" takes place. We have the calendar year starting as it does in January. We are also affected by the tax year which starts in April, for some that may not have a great impact, but for others the end of one tax year and the beginning of another means there is a great deal of work to face. The Church calendar starts at yet another time of year. Advent Sunday is on the fourth Sunday before Christmas, and that can occur in November or December. As if that were not enough 'starts' for us, there is one other which has a deep significance for many people, and that is the start of the School or educational year. This occurs for most people on some date in September, although if you are moving to University it may not actually start until October. It is this version of a New Year for which many people are now starting to prepare. The summer holidays, the time to wind down after one year and think about the start of a new academic one.

In this time of vacancy, this idea of 'ending' and 'starting' is something we can appreciate as we look forward with anticipation to starting with a new incumbent.

This ending and starting is a crucial part of our faith journey as well. At the centre of our Christian belief is the idea of forgiveness, and the opportunity to start again. We all make mistakes and the Bible tells us that the God we worship is a forgiving God. Take time this summer to look at the stories of 'The Lost Son' in Luke 15 and of Jonah in the Old Testament, and we see a God of second chances. Our heavenly Father is someone who wants to allow his people to make a new start. We see this too in John's gospel, where the risen Jesus allows Peter, who had denied he even knew Jesus, to make a fresh start.

There are times in all our lives when we need to recognise that chance to make a fresh start. Our faith and trust in a forgiving God is a model which we are all encouraged to copy; as we are forgiven by God and allowed to start again, so we should forgive each other and allow each other to make a fresh start when needed.

Our faith is about forgiveness and renewal - out with the old, in with the new. May we live in constant awareness of this good news for us and for all the people we meet?

<u>Vacancy update</u> Our Parish Profile, the document that goes to all prospective candidates, has been accepted by the Diocese and we are now in the process of agreeing the job advert. Our hope is that we will be advertising for our new Vicar by the end of June. In terms of estimating timescales: typically the closing date for



applications is 3-4 weeks after the advert and then a further 2 weeks until interview. The successful candidate may then have to give notice which could take a further 3 months. So we may be looking at an appointment being made by November and that's assuming there is a successful candidate. There is a possibility that it may be sooner than that if our new Vicar is a Curate coming from his or her training. It is very difficult to be certain but we will keep you informed as much as we can.

In the meantime, the PCC, is doing its best to manage the Parish and we are grateful to those who are working hard to make sure that everything is running as smoothly as it can.
